On May 7th, 2020, Agents with the Tehama County Major Crimes Unit served a high-risk search warrant in the 1000 block of 6th Ave in Corning as part of the ongoing investigation into this case.

During the execution of the warrant, agents located and recovered additional evidence in relation to this ongoing investigation.

As of date of this release, the Tehama County Major Crimes Unit has identified Roberto Valencia as a suspect in this case and an arrest warrant has been issued for his arrest for the charge of Murder.

Agents are actively attempting to locate Roberto Valencia and are asking for anyone with information to contact the Tehama County Sheriff's Office, Major Crimes Unit at (530) 529-7920.

On May 3rd, 2020, an autopsy was performed on both victims at the Tehama County Sheriff's Office. Victim #1 was positively identified as Edgar Alejandro Villa Valencia, age 22 of Corning. Mr. Valencia was the victim transported to Saint Elizabeth's Hospital. Mr. Valencia died from a gunshot wound to the torso.

Victim #2 was positively identified as Juan Manuel Valencia Vargas, age 20 of Corning. Mr. Vargas was located at the scene of the shooting, in Thomes creek. Mr. Vargas died from a gunshot wound to the torso.

This investigation is ongoing.

SUMMARY OF INCIDENT: On April 30th, 2020 around 8:00 PM, deputies from the Tehama County Sheriff's Office were dispatched to Thomes Creek just north of Richfield, regarding a shooting incident.

While deputies were enroute to the scene of the shooting, Victim #1, arrived at Saint Elizabeth's Hospital, being transported by friends. Victim #1 suffered a single gunshot wound and succumbed to his injury at the hospital.

During the response to the scene of the shooting a Tehama County Sheriff's Deputy was travelling southbound on Highway 99W near Gyle Road with his lights and siren activated. A semi-truck pulled into the deputy's path by making a northbound turn from Gyle Road onto Highway 99W. The deputy took evasive action; however clipped the trailer of the semi-truck. This caused the deputy to lose control and crash his patrol vehicle. The deputy was extricated from the vehicle and transported by ambulance to Saint

Elizabeth's hospital for treatment. He was released with minor injuries several hours later. The traffic collision was investigated by the Red Bluff area California Highway Patrol Office.

The Tehama County Major Crimes Unit (TMCU) responded to the initial scene of the shooting to take over the investigation. While processing evidence at the scene, Major Crime investigators located a blood trail leading to a nearby creek. During a search of the area for additional victims, Major Crimes investigators located Victim #2, who was unresponsive and determined to be deceased. He was located approximately 200 yards from the original scene in the creek bed. Victim #2 also suffered from at least one gunshot wound.

The scene was processed by the Tehama Major Crimes Unit and the Department of Justice Crime Scene Unit. The California Highway Patrol and Corning Police Department also assisted in the investigation.

The identity of both Victims has been withheld, pending notification to next of kin.
