

**PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY BY
THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES**

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2.18.040 of Tehama County empowers the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when said County is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity and the County Board of Supervisors is not in session, and;


WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of California proclaimed a State of Emergency in the State related to the series of atmospheric river systems predicted to strike California, bringing high winds, substantial precipitation, and river and urban flooding, and;

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services of the County of Tehama does hereby find; That conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within said County, caused by the Winter Storm systems which began December 27, 2022 and continued through the first two weeks of January of 2023 causing localized flooding over roadways, disruption in traffic along roadways, damage to roadways and bridges and that further conditions of extreme peril are threatened by forecasted storms due to strike Tehama County in the last half of the second week of January, 2023; That these conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of Tehama County, and; That the County Board of Supervisors of Tehama County is not in session and cannot immediately be called into session;

WHEREAS, The County of Tehama is requesting State CDAA (California Disaster Assistance Act) and any other Federal assistance to reduce the extreme peril and return critical infrastructure to a safe state for the Citizens of Tehama County;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED that a local emergency now exists throughout Tehama County, and;

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that during the existence of said local emergency the powers, functions, and duties of the emergency organization of Tehama County shall be those prescribed by state law, by ordinances, and resolutions of this County, and; That this emergency proclamation shall expire in 7 days after issuance unless confirmed and ratified by the governing body of the County of Tehama.
